### Money well spent

### How to get the most bang for your buck in almost any situation

WHETHER IT'S HIGH HOUSING AND GAS PRICES or your regular household bills, you may be feeling squeezed financially. You work hard for your money – and you want to spend it wisely.

That's why it pays to do a little legwork to ensure you're getting the best value for money. It may take a bit of time (something that can seem a bit intimidating). But it can be done. Below, we've outlined a few key steps to help you ensure your purchase is worth every penny.

Review your regular bills and statements frequently to ensure you're being charged accurately and pay attention to any new service plans or offers in the marketplace. ## Water/Sewer Invoices
