Money well spent

How to get the most bang for your buck in almost any situation

WHETHER IT'S HIGH HOUSING AND GAS PRICES or your regular household bills, you may be feeling squeezed financially. You work hard for your money – and you want to spend it wisely.

Water/Sewer Invoices

Soon we will mail the last water bills for this fiscal year. A discount of 5% is eligible on current amounts paid in November. An interest charge of 10% is added to all outstanding accounts. Accounts left unpaid cost you a minimum of \$26.00 per quarter plus the possibility of losing service.

Yearend Preparations

Owners with outstanding property taxes will receive a courtesy reminder letter in December. There are 80 accounts outstanding for a total of \$183,450. If not paid by December 31, 2018 a 20% penalty will be applied on January 1st. This money represents the Town's operating funds.
