





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### **STRETCHING YOUR BONUS**

#### Things to keep in mind before spending your next bonus.

Chances are you've already spent the bonus you've been expecting- in your imagination, anyway. It's not hard for most people to come up with ways to spend a lump sum of money.

Before rushing out to spend your next yearly bonus make sure you keep in mind that you haven't paid tax on it yet. Typically, the government will withhold taxes based on your top marginal rate. So, if your top tax rate is 43 percent that \$10,000 bonus could turn into \$5700.

#### Responsible spending

If you decide to use the money now, here are some suggestions to help you ensure you'll have something to show for that money in the longer term:

> Pay down debts, starting with those that are not income tax –deductible. For example, student

loans are generally deductible, as are loans taken out to make investments, whereas credit card debt is not.

- Pay down your mortgage. Every time you reduce your mortgage you save money in interest.
- If you don't own a house yet, consider setting up a high-interest bank account to save for your first home.
- Deposit the money into your Tax-Free Savings Account.
- Contribute to your RRSP. Not only will you be contributing to your retirement savings but you could also get money back on your income tax return.
- Buy yourself something substantial that you've been waiting for and which will enhance your quality of life for some time. Maybe now is the time for that home renovation project.
- Consider making a gift to a charity or a political party. Both of these options offer tax credits.
- Start an RESP for your child or a niece/nephew, or grandchild or

contribute to one that already exists.
