

BYLAW NO. 2009 – 6

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF ROCANVILLE IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE OPERATION OF ATV'S UPON CERTAIN PUBLIC ROADWAYS AND OTHER AREAS WITHIN CORPORATE TOWN LIMITS.

The Council of the Town of Rocanville, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw may be referred to as “The ATV Bylaw”.
2. In this bylaw:
 - a) “all terrain vehicle” and/or “ATV” means all terrain vehicles as defined in The All Terrain Vehicles Act;
 - b) “commercial operation” means a properly-licenced business located within the municipality that sells and/or repairs ATVs;
 - c) “derby” means a special event at which multiple ATVs will gather at one point to register and depart/return;
 - d) “municipality” means the Town of Rocanville;
 - e) “public land” means public land as defined in The All Terrain Vehicles Act;
 - f) “public roadway” means a “highway” as defined in The Traffic Safety Act and includes any public roadway designed and/or intended for use by the general public for the passage of vehicles;
 - g) “traveled portion” means part of a public roadway including the shoulder of the road;
 - h) “un-traveled portion”, means part of a public roadway not designed for vehicle travel including the ditch and the centre median; and
 - i) “vehicle” means a vehicle as defined in The Traffic Safety Act.
3. It shall be lawful to operate an All Terrain Vehicle (ATV):
 - a) only during the hours between 7:00 am and 10:00 pm, in accordance with the municipality’s Noise Bylaw;
 - b) at a speed no greater than thirty (30) kilometers per hour;
 - c) on the traveled portion of public roadways for the sole purpose of transportation to and from the outside limits of the municipality and where the ATV is stored; and
 - d) subsection 3.c) does not apply to Provincial Highway No. 8 nor to Ellice Street except for the purpose of crossing said Highway/Street.
4. Commercial operations will be permitted to operate on public roadways for the purpose of ATV testing.
5. Derbies will be permitted but expected to operate in accordance with this bylaw.
6. No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle on any public land within the corporate limits of the municipality.
7. The provisions of The All Terrain Vehicles Act shall apply to the operators of ATVs.
8. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalty imposed by The All Terrain Vehicles Act.
9. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon May 6, 2009.
